Plus, Roger Thompson, Educational Lead at the MVRP, as they explain how Restorative Thinking:

- Provides teachers with information on how to best engage with children to help control their emotions and repair broken relationships
- Works with students to recognise their strengths, develop their relationship and learning goals
- Makes sure that what goes on at school does not re-traumatise or trigger aggression and anxiety
- Has knock-on benefits in terms of attitudes towards school exclusion.
